



## I-880 Express Lanes Construction Update January 27, 2017

## **The Project**

The Metropolitan Transportation
Commission is constructing express
lanes on I-880 between Dixon
Landing Rd. in Fremont and
Hegenber Rd. in Oakland.
Conststruction began in September
2017 is anticipated to continue
through 2019. View the project fact

## **Current Work**

Crews have mostly completed installing CIDH (Cast in Drilled Hole) pile foundations in the corridor.

These foundations will support the express lane overhead sign gantries and tolling equipment. Directional boring and conduit installation continues throughout the corridor. Work will occur during the day and night and will require some temporary nighttime <u>ramp closures</u>. Ramp closures will have posted signage.

<u>Tree removal</u> on the southbound side of I-880 both north and south of Hacienda Avenue in San Lorenzo started in mid January and is expected to continue Monday night, January 29<sup>th</sup>, into Tuesday morning, January 30<sup>th</sup>, and again on Tuesday night, into Wednesday morning, January 31<sup>st</sup>. The trees are being removed to widen I-880 for a short distance to create additional lane width that will allow vehicles to more easily merge into or out of the express lane and improve traffic flow. Crews are expected to begin work at 8 p.m. each night.

## What to Expect

- Concrete trucks, cranes, and rebar cages will be present in the median.
- Construction lighting will be present at night.
- Nighttime lane and ramp closures will occur intermittently.

- Weekend daytime lane closures may occur.
- Electrical work will occur on the shoulder.
- Shoulder lanes will be closed during the day intermittently.
- Noise from tree removal activity, including chainsaws and wood chippers.
- Tree removal equipment staged in the area and truck traffic transporting downed trees
