

Context: Program Background



Priority Development Area (PDA) Program

- 80 Planning and 50 Technical Assistance grants since 2007
- Added capacity for more 150,000 homes and 100,000,000 commercial square feet
- Identified improvements are supported through OBAG program



Priority Production Area (PPA) Pilot

- New program introduced in Plan Bay Area 2050
- Goal: assist local governments preserve and expand their PPAs, strengthening the region's economy and creating middle wage jobs.

- Who is eligible? Local governments
- What is eligible?Plans, Plan Amendments, &Plan Implementation
- When is the Deadline?To apply: February 23, 2023To finalize contract: August 31, 2023To complete project: 36 months from contract

✓ Plan to be completed, amended, or implemented will include:

Development standards

□ Public realm standards

□ Community and equity policies

□ Capital improvements

□ Implementation plan

□ Consistent zoning

□ Programmatic CEQA clearance (e.g., programmatic EIR)

Council or Planning Commission support

Consistent with MTC's Transit-Oriented Communities (TOC) Policy

PDA Grants: Example of Ineligible Applications

- × Any activity that does not result in adopted policy during the grant period
- × Standalone studies or strategies
- × CEQA with Level of Service (LOS) analysis
- Plan for area around a rail station, ferry, or BRT stop that is not anticipated to comply with MTC's Transit-Oriented Communities Policy





Screening:

- Final plan must contain all required elements
- Local support: resolution or information item
- Housing Element: substantial compliance by 12/31/23
- Consistent with Transit Oriented Communities policy

Scoring:

- Program priorities (e.g., Specific Plans for unplanned PDAs)
- Housing protection, preservation, and production
- Mobility and VMT reduction
- Inclusive communities (e.g., racial equity strategies, universal design)
- Strategic impact (e.g., Plan Bay Area, RHNA implementation)

When applying:

□Use the checklist in the applicant guide (p 2. of <u>Applicant Guide</u>)

□Secure elected official support ASAP (see template <u>resolution</u>, <u>staff report</u>, and <u>presentation</u>)

□Anticipate staff time required for project management if awarded grant

Once you've received an award:

Get started on a consultant RFP, if applicable, right away
Continue to allocate enough staff time throughout project
Communicate with MTC/ABAG grant managers frequently
Brief elected officials throughout plan





MTC/ABAG offers a variety of technical assistance that can support projects ineligible for this round of PDA funding

- Housing
- <u>Parking</u> (apply for grants now)
- <u>Complete Streets</u>
- <u>LOS to VMT</u> (SB743)
- Mobility Hubs (apply for grants now)

PPA Grants: Key Requirements

- Implementation Focused proposals that will result in adoption of program, policies, or plan.
- Quantifiable Goals with Targeted Impact jobs created/preserved, infrastructure costs/investment, establishing development standards and fees.
- **PPA Centered** while other industrial areas may benefit, the focus of analysis and program implementation must be oriented towards improved outcomes for, and performance of PPAs.



PPA Grants: Evaluation Criteria

Screening:

- Application must identify PPA(s) included in Plan Bay Area 2050
- Draft scope of work and deliverables

Scoring:

- Program priorities: increasing opportunity, expanding employment in a community with a jobs-housing imbalance, benefiting low or moderateresource communities, meets a demonstrated funding need
- Strategic impact
- Consistency with local plans and policies

Pilot Priority Production Area Grant Application

Introduction

Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) is soliciting proposals for Priority Production Areas (PPAs) that have been adopted into the Plan Bay Area Growth Framework.

The Priority Production Area (PPA) Pilot Program is soliciting proposals in the following categories:

- 1. Individual Jurisdiction Planning Grants (up to \$750,000) Grants for local jurisdictions to develop specific plans establishing development standards and identifying capital improvement needs and financing strategies.
- 2. Individual Jurisdiction Technical Assistance Grants (up to \$250,000) Technical assistance to local jurisdictions for discrete projects, such as feasibility analyses of proposed policies/programs or implementation of specific economic strategies. It is expected that TA grants will produce the analysis and materials necessary to get the proposed program implemented or policy adopted.
- 3. Multi-Jurisdiction Technical Assistance Grants (up to \$750,000) Technical assistance projects focused on developing shared analyses or frameworks for implementing programs/policies across multiple PPAs. It is expected that multi-jurisdiction TA grants will provide the feasibility analysis, framework, and template materials necessary for local staff to get PPA-related programs or policies adopted.

The following application must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. February 23, 2023 to be considered.

- 1. Assess program goals with internal team.
- 2. Email <u>pdas@bayareametro.gov</u> or <u>ppas@bayareametro.gov</u> to schedule discussion of preliminary ideas with MTC/ABAG staff at weekly "office hours" Wednesday 9AM-12PM.
- 3. Confirm alignment with existing policies and get policy maker support for application if necessary.
- 4. Submit online proposal by February 23rd



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
